#### Diagnosis headwinds

40 % of all people with AD get a formal diagnosis

• Of those, 30% Dx is not disclosed It's driven by demographics.

- Spouses and partners die.
- Younger aged persons in 55+ communities get old.
- It's a function of wealth and how we live non multigenerational lives
- 40% boomer divorce rate
- Never marrieds
- LGBTQ community


# Other marginalized persons

- Former prisoners.
- Persons with lifelong mental illness.
- Likely many (male) veterans.



### What can I do?

- Be a friend.
- Coach planning.



What are the risks? How are they expressed?

- Distress managing their cognitive illness
- Compromised health
- Victim of fraud or poor judgment
- Depression and Anxiety
- Inability to navigate health issues/hospitalization
- Loss of rights/Societal attitudes
- Poverty and low socio-economic status generally

Distress managing their cognitive illness

I'm afraid my thinking problems will take over my life.

### Compromised health

 I have diabetes and sometimes with memory and judgement issues I make mistakes with my insulin. Victim of fraud or poor judgment

• I don't want to lose my nest egg but I need to trust someone.

#### Depression, Anxiety

- I'm so lonely and alone inside my home and my head.
- I'm anxious all the time and sleep poorly.

### Inability to navigate health issues/hospitalization

- If I ever go to the hospital will I get home?
- How can someone get my medical record?
- Does anyone know who to call to be my advocate in an emergency?
- Will my advance care wishes be known or honored?

## Loss of rights/Societal attitudes

- I still have good judgement.
- I have rights to self determination.
- I don't need protecting.
- Everyone with dementia is different;
   we're not all totally disabled/end stages.
