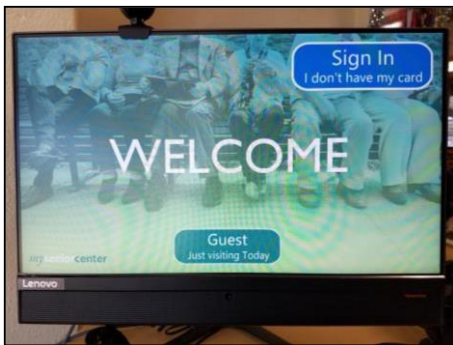

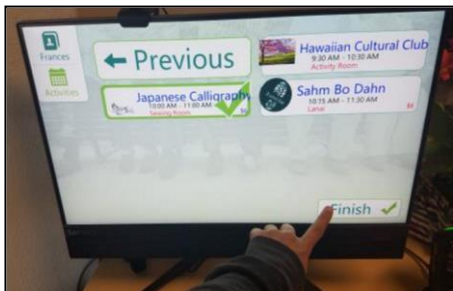


Please scan your green LMPSC card at the Greeter Desk located at the front door **each** time you visit the Center. Visitors are also asked to check-in.

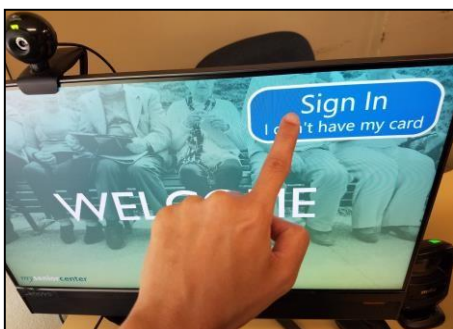
Welcome! Please have your green LMPSC card ready to sign in.

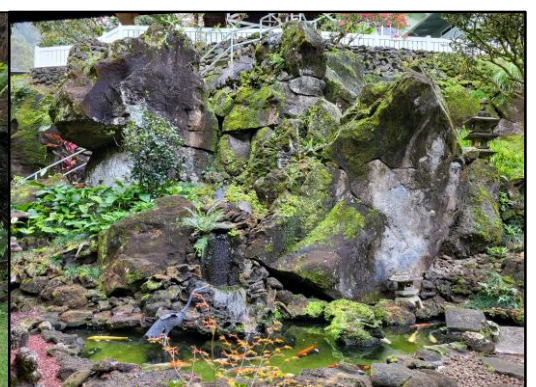
