

You only need to carry 1 or 2 ID's & credit cards, in the event it's lost or stolen, least amount in your wallet to replace. Check your account for fraudulent charges. Call 911 immediately if you feel you are being scammed. Always be aware, as scammers pry on senior citizens. The morning was filled with valuable information on safety.




